I have been a governor at school for just over a year now and I am really enjoying it. I attend six meetings a year that last about an hour either in school or on a team's link. There are also a couple of whole day visits that all the governors attend. In the meetings we discuss a variety of items that relate to the school curriculum, school finance, and a Head Teachers report that gives an overview of how school is doing. At the monitoring days we get to watch the staff and children in action and observe some lessons to evidence the School Improvement Plan.

Being a governor is an important role and our job is to make sure the school is being run properly and that the children's welfare and learning is at the heart of everything that the school do.

Maths Curriculum

We have been making some exciting improvements to our maths curriculum, building on work that began in the summer term of the last academic year. These developments are already having a positive impact across the school.

This year, every maths lesson now follows a refreshed structure designed to support and challenge all learners. Lessons begin with a fluency starter to strengthen arithmetic and times-table recall, followed by a journaling task that gives pupils regular opportunities to explain their thinking, reason mathematically and develop their problem-solving skills. Our new "I do, we do, you do" approach ensures clear modelling, supported practice and independent application are built into every session so that all children can succeed. While EYFS follow the same overall structure, their learning is centred around the Mastering Number programme, giving pupils a strong foundation in number sense from the start.

To support our whole-school journey, Miss Taylor and Miss Hadfield are participating in a Maths Hub Work Group, helping us continue to develop our mastery approach and enhance teaching and learning. We are also delighted to share that we now have a draft whole-school shared vision for maths, created collaboratively with input from staff, governors, pupils and parents. This shared vision will guide our work and reflects our high aspirations for maths across the school. This will be shared in due course once finalised!





As part of our focus on fluency, we have also been holding TTRS competitions across school, against Parton School and with a Teachers V pupils tournament. This has brought lots of fun and excitement to our learning!

Eco Warriors

Our Eco Warriors have made a brilliant start since being recruited at the beginning of the academic year. This term, they reviewed our school's Climate Action Plan and agreed on the key priorities they want to focus on. They have invited teachers to select Eco Monitors for each classroom, ensuring we all do our part to save energy and avoid unnecessary waste.

The team also organised a successful Walk to School Week and even delivered an assembly to share their ideas and inspire other pupils to get involved. We walked a whopping 29.487 steps - that's about 14.69 miles. Well done to everyone who took part!



There's plenty more planned for the rest of the year, including taking part in the national Walk to School Week in Summer and exploring ways we can raise money for new solar panels. We're excited to see what they achieve next!

Christmas Celebrations


half term we have held lots of Christmas events for pupils, parents and our community.
