Class 1 in class this week we have looked a little more closely at our traditional tales. We have discussed Goldilocks and her naughty behaviour and made links in to PSHE, with 'stranger danger'. Alongside this we have had our reception children walking around the village finding things but with the aim of crossing roads safely. Reception children have used their sentences to aid their comprehension skills. In maths they have begun to find and follow patterns of their own and begun to find patterns in number. Y1 children have been sequencing their stories around a beginning, middle and end. In maths we have worked at more depth with place value. Ask your child what each numbers' value is, in 684, for instance.

Class 2 We have been focusing on times tables this week and are doing really well with fast recall of the 3 times table. In English writing, we have been selecting words to create 'nice' and 'nasty' atmospheres. In reading we have been practising sequencing the mixed up parts of traditional tales to put events in the correct order.

School Uniform A few parents have asked us about the school uniform so just a reminder that school uniform is now ordered directly by the parents on line, from the Florence and Fred Tesco website. Just google 'Tesco School Uniform Embroidery Service' and when prompted type in our school name and it will bring up our range of uniform which shows the P E top, book bag, back pack, white polo top and navy sweatshirt or cardigan. Some parents have mentioned that the sweatshirts are 'V' neck, however, the descriptions for the jumper are 'crew' or 'round' neck so if you receive V necks you will need to contact them again to point out their error. The trousers, pinafores or skirts can be purchased from your preferred retailer. (Grey or Black)

Footwear Next year the children will be using 'step counters' to improve activity rates for pupils so we are recommending the children wear plain-ish trainers rather than school shoes. This will mean they can run and do activities during play times without having to change their shoes or worry about forgetting their trainers for P.E. sessions.

Jewellery If you decide to get your child's ears pierced, please do so at the beginning of the summer holidays and train your child to be able to remove them for when they return back to school in September, as they are not allowed to do P.E. wearing jewellery. Jewellery is not allowed to be worn unless it is a pair of small stud earrings or a watch to avoid valuable items being lost
