Class 1: Our new topic is Journeys and significant people. We have already watched a short DVD about Jules Vern's Journey to the centre of the Earth. The children have discussed ways to travel from walking to submarines, hot air balloons, and fictional travel on magic carpets. In class we are now growing Painted Lady butterflies. In one week the caterpillars have grown considerably. In maths we have been focusing on one more but linking this to money too. During our art sessions we have linked butterflies and maths with looking at symmetry.

Class 2: This week we have enjoyed learning about Lynley-Dood-Author of The Hairy Maclarey book series. Linked to this we have been learning about rhyme and have written "caring for dogs" leaflet in English lesson. In maths we have made bar charts about our favorite pets and icecreams. We are also revising money work. In technology we have designed and made adverts for milkshakes. In Geography we have found out about the journey of milk and in music enjoyed playing "How much is that doggie in the window?" on the key board.

Class 3: This week class 3 have started to look at our new topic of Ancient Egypt. The children have asked some super questions of what they would like to learn. We have explored the change in Geography of Egypt and the importance off the River Nile. We continue to recap and stretch our fractions which the children recalled well. The children have started to look at programming and engineering skills using Lego Spike Prime Robot .They used Geography, Science and coaching skills and showed great enthusiasm. We have restarted our Judo and Swimming and have all done a fantastic job! They all showed brilliant listening skills and enthusiasm to try. Keep up the good work class 3.

Class 4: Class 4 have had a very, very busy start to the new term and our topic of The Egyptians. We have started to research and create artefacts and fact cards for the museum which we are making in our conservatory. We have been back to swimming, which everyone was so excited about and loved, as well as learning Judo with Janice. Sonny and Dion have kindly donated their back issues of the Science magazine 'Whizz, Pop, Bang" and everyone has really enjoyed reading them and they are inspiring even more independent enquiry work including Theo who is planning to carry out an investigation about life on Mars (and has handed me a huge shopping list of equipment and materials that he will need) and Reggie who is busily designing a toilet for an astronaut, and researching the seas of the moon. In maths, we have designed and made board games, created questions and written rules that will help us to improve our maths knowledge and speed.



Lola is doing some serious computation in her head. She and Macie have included an explanation of BIDMAS to help younger players.

What to bring with you...

Lowca Primary Juniors – 1 night residential

Once you have arrived at Bassenfell there will be a short welcome talk and then you will be going straight out canoeing. You won't be going to your bedrooms or unpacking your luggage until later in the day, so it's important that you follow the instructions below so that you have what you need for the day. Please make sure all items are labelled with your name.

What to wear on the day of your arrival:

Please come dressed ready for canoeing in warm, comfy clothes that you don't mind getting wet :

- Warm tracksuit bottoms (not jeans)
- T-shirt/thermal
- Warm jumper / fleece
- Trainers (that you don't mind getting wet)

Pack these items in a bag or rucksack which you will keep with you throughout the day:

- Waterproof jacket (and waterproof trousers if you have them)
- Spare t-shirt, jumper, trousers, underwear and trainers (to change into when the other ones get wet)
- Towel
- Packed lunch for Thursday lunchtime
- Waterbottle and drink
- Hat and gloves (if cool)
- Sun cream and sun hat (if warm and sunny!)
- Any medication needed

Put a large sticky label on this bag with your name on.

Pack these items in a separate bag/suitcase which will be stored until teatime:

- Slippers/indoor shoes
- Extra set of clothes, underwear and socks
- Sleeping bag and pillow case
- Pyjamas
- Bin bag for dirty clothes
- Toiletries – soap, toothbrush, toothpaste
- Torch
- Clock or watch

Put a large sticky label on this bag with your name on.
