**Upper Junior:** Lewis for his fact re-call and his work using our timeline during our 'time travel' adventures

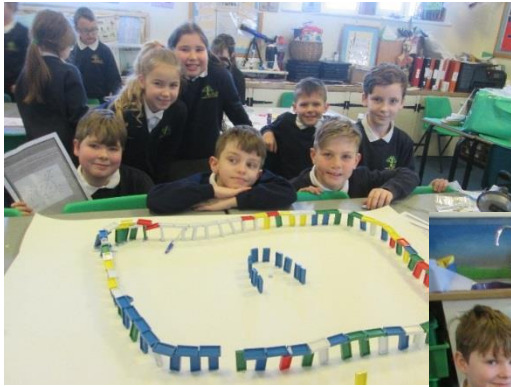
**Lower Junior:** Keely for her imagination and her reasoning skills during our 'time travel' adventures

**Class 1** This week in the infants the reception children have been sorting their numbers using various criteria. In English they have been looking at rhyme and alliteration. Ask your child if they can think of words like cc-Clever Cat or bbb-Blue Bouncing Ball. Year 1 and 2 have been doing Viking reading comprehensions and answering questions both verbally and written. In maths we have been focusing on mental addition using base 10 to add two numbers together. We had a lovely afternoon in the garden yesterday and we enjoyed welcoming our 2 new children Grace and Luca who will be joining us full time next week!

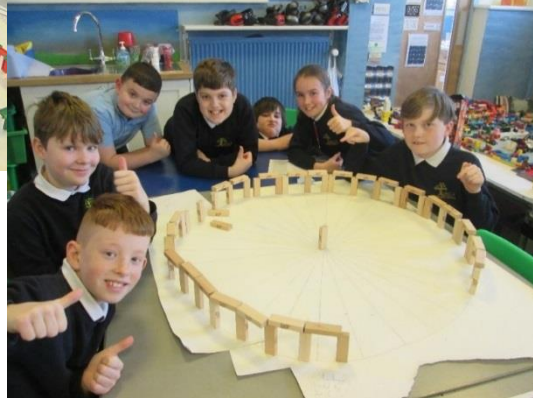
**Class 2** In our year 3 'time machine' we have looked at the castles of medieval times and the feudal system. We have written great factual pieces and have mastered how to do an introduction and captions. We have also dropped in on Tudor times to look at the style of buildings, such as the Globe theatre and the Carlisle's Guildhall. Maths has been a focus upon money this week and we know about equivalent values and how to calculate change. In classroom 3 the pupils have also been visiting the past. In maths they took inspiration from stone-henge.

**Class 3** Year 4 looked at how 2 dimensional shapes or nets can be made into 3-d shapes, year 5 developed their perimeter awareness by measuring the circumference of the circle, and year 6 was even more advanced looking at segments of a circle and internal angles of 2d shapes!
